Uvod

Nedelja privatnosti je godišnji događaj koji se održava tokom poslednje nedelje januara u Beogradu, povodom obeležavanja Dana zaštite podataka o ličnosti (28. januara). Nedelja privatnosti prvi put je održana 2021. godine, 10 godina nakon što su Partneri Srbija, zajedno sa Povernikom za informacije od javnog značaja i zaštitu podataka o ličnosti, prvi put u Srbiji obeležili Dan zaštite podataka o ličnosti. Događaj se fokusira na diskusije o pitanjima privatnosti i zaštite podataka sa stručnjacima iz civilnog, privatnog i javnog sektora.

S obzirom da su pitanja privatnosti i zaštite podataka o ličnosti posebno naglašena pandemijom virusa Covid-19, ubrzanim razvojem novih tehnologija, kao i procesom digitalizacije javnih usluga, Nedelja privatnosti se organizuje kako bi se povećalo razumevanje javnosti o različitim pitanjima u vezi prava na privatnost, i kako bi se razvila diskusija o stanju zaštite privatnosti u Srbiji i na globalnom nivou.

Nedelja privatnosti 2023 održava se od 23. do 26. januara 2023. godine. Događaj će biti organizovan u hibridnom formatu, koji je pokazao da pruža najveće mogućnosti za učešće zainteresovanima iz drugih gradova i država. Kroz seriju panela, okruglih stolova, radionica i prezentacija, stvaramo prostor u kome predstavnici javnog, civilnog i privatnog sektora, kao i šira javnost, mogu da razgovaraju, povećaju međusobno razumevanje i iniciraju promene u oblasti zaštite privatnosti. Ove godine, posebno želimo da istaknemo važnost obezbeđivanja adekvatnog nadzora i javne kontrole nad obradom ličnih podataka od strane državnih i privatnih aktera, posebno u društvima koja se suočavaju sa nedovoljno razvijenom vladavinom prava.

Introduction

Privacy Week is an annual event held during the last week of January in Belgrade, Serbia, in order to mark the Data Protection Day (28 January). It was established in 2021, 10 years after Partners Serbia, together with the Commissioner for Access to Information of Public Importance and Personal Data Protection, marked the Data Protection Day for the first time in Serbia. The event centers around discussions on privacy and data protection issues with experts from the civil, private, and the public sector.

Given that the issues of privacy and protection of personal data are particularly emphasized by the Covid-19 pandemic, the accelerated development of new technologies, as well as the process of digitization of public services, Privacy Week is organized to increase the understanding of the public about various issues related to the right to privacy, and in order to develop a discussion about the state of privacy protection, in Serbia and at the global level.

Privacy Week 2023 takes place from 23 to 26 January, 2023. The event will be organized in a hybrid format, which has proven to provide the greatest opportunity for participation by those interested in the event from other cities and countries. Through a series of panels, round tables, workshops and presentations, we create a space where representatives of the public, civil, and private sector, as well as the interested public can talk, increase mutual understanding, and initiate changes in the field of privacy protection. This year, we especially want to highlight the importance of ensuring adequate scrutiny and public control over the processing of personal data by state and private actors, especially in societies that are faced with insufficiently developed rule of law.

I panel: Video nadzor i upotreba sistema za prepoznavanje lica- evropska perspektiva

Paralelno sa sve većom upotrebom masovnog biometrijskog nadzora u celom svetu, sve se glasnije čuju oni koji pozivaju na njegovo zabranjivanje. Iskustva koja u ovoj oblasti dolaze iz evropskih zemalja, a naročito zemalja članica EU, su različita, kako na nivou prakse, tako i na nivou regulative. I dok evropske organizacije civilnog društva i grupe za zaštitu ljudskih prava upozoravaju na negativne efekte upotrebe biometrijskog nadzora na ljudska prava (od privatnosti, do slobode okupljanja i slobode izražavanja), regulatori iz EU aktivno rade na usvajanju jedinstvenih pravila koja bi mogla da obezbede veću pravnu sigurnost za građane, kao i jasne i sprovodljive standarde za države članice. A to se pokazalo kao priličan izazov.

I panel: Video Surveillance and the Use of Facial Recognition Systems; European Perspective

Parallel with the increase of the use of mass biometric surveillance worldwide, the voices calling for its ban are becoming louder. Experiences in European, especially the EU-member countries in this area have varied, both at the practical and regulatory level. And while the European civil society and human rights groups are warning about the negative effects the use of biometric surveillance has on human rights (from privacy to freedom of assembly and freedom of expression), the EU regulators have been actively working on adopting the unifying rules that could provide more legal certainty for citizens, as well as clear and enforceable standards for the member states. And this has been proved to be quite a challenge.

Zbog toga će se na panelu o video nadzoru i korišćenju sistema za prepoznavanje lica razgovarati o trenutnoj situaciji u pogledu usvajanja Zakona o veštačkoj inteligenciji za prostor Evropske unije i o njegovim mogućim rešenjima za korišćenje biometrijskog nadzora u EU. Takođe će se razgovarati o mogućem uticaju ovih događaja na zakonodavstva i prakse zemalja koje nisu članice EU, kao i o celokupnoj budućoj perspektivi društava u kojima se koriste tehnologije masovnog nadzora.

Olga Kyrlyiuk je doktorirala iz oblasti međunarodnog prava i trenutno je koordinator za digitalna prava za Internjuzov projekat „Veća sloboda interneta – Srbija“. Pre toga je radila kao direktor tehničkog programa u Inicijativi za vladavinu prava Američkog udruženja pravnika, gde je bila zadužena za regionalni program zastupanja za slobodu interneta u Evropi i Evroaziji. Takođe je predsedavajuća Dijaloga o upravljanju internetom u Jugoistočnoj Evropi (SEEDIG) koji pokriva 20 zemalja iz Jugoistočne Evrope i okoline, kao i predstavnica Evrope u Izvršnom odboru komponente nekomercijalnih korisnika u Internet korporaciji za dodeljena imena i brojeve. Gospođa Kyrlyiuk ima više od deset godina radnog iskustva u oblastima upravljanja internetom i ljudskih prava.

Katerina Rodelli je analitičarka za javne politike Evropske Unije u Access Now, koja radi na pitanjima vezanim za biometrijski nadzor i veštačku inteligenciju, sa glavnim fokusom na presek tehnologije i državnih granica. Trenutno je fokusirana na Akt o veštačkoj inteligenciji Evropske Unije i deo je koalicije civilnog društva koja se zalaže da se u centar regulative postave osnovna prava, kao i da se odbace institucionalizovani oblici masovnog biometrijskog nadzora i upotrebe sistema zasnovanih na AI koji ovekovečuju diskriminaciju i ugnjetavanje migranata i marginalizovanih zajednica.

Therefore, the panel on video surveillance and the use of facial recognition systems will discuss the current state of play on the adoption of the EU AI Act and its possible solutions related to the use of biometric surveillance in the European Union. Possible impact of these developments to other, non-EU legislations and practices will be also discussed, as well as the overall perspectives of future of societies where the mass surveillance technologies are utilized.

Olga Kyrlyiuk has PhD in International Law and is currently a Digital Rights Coordinator for Greater Internet Freedom – Serbia project at Internews. Prior to that she worked as Technical Program Manager at the American Bar Association Rule of Law Initiative in charge of regional Internet freedom advocacy program in Europe and Eurasia. She is also a Chair of SEEDIG – South Eastern European Dialogue on Internet Governance covering 20 countries from South Eastern Europe and the neighboring area, and Europe Representative at Executive Committee of Non-Commercial Users Constituency at Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers. Ms. Kyrlyiuk has over ten years of work experience in the field of Internet governance and human rights.

Caterina Rodelli is an EU policy analyst at Access Now, working on issues related to biometric surveillance, artificial intelligence, with her main focus on the intersection between technology and borders. Currently, she focuses on the proposed EU Regulation on the Artificial Intelligence Act and is part of a civil society coalition that advocates for the legislation to put fundamentals rights at the center, and to reject institutionalized forms of biometric mass surveillance and the use of AI-based systems that perpetuates discrimination and oppression against migrants and marginalized communities.

Ella Jakubowska je viši politički savetnik u Evropskoj mreži za digitalna prava (EDRI), najvećoj evropskoj mreži nevladinih organizacija za digitalna prava. Ona je lider u oblastima biometrije, prava EU o prekograničnoj razmeni ličnih podataka od strane policije i uredbe EU o sprečavanju seksualnog zlostavljanja dece na internetu, a takođe podržava napore u vezi sa Zakonom EU o veštačkoj inteligenciji. U okviru svojih aktivnosti protiv masovnog biometrijskog nadzora, saraduje sa kolegama iz čitave Evrope u cilju protivljenja zakonima ili politikama koje tretiraju ljude kao hodajuće barkodove. U okviru svog celokupnog rada, Ella se bori za zaštitu prava na privatnost, slobodno izražavanje i nediskriminaciju. Obučena je iz oblasti sociologije tehnologije i snažno se interesuje za intersekcijске feminističke pristupe. Tokom 2021. godine, Politico Europe je proglasio Ellu jednom od 28 najuticajnijih osoba u evropskom tehnološkom prostoru.

Bogdan Manolea je izvršni direktor organizacije za digitalna prava ApTI Rumunija. Bogdan ima pravno obrazovanje i veliko iskustvo od preko 20 godina u oblasti prava i informaciono-komunikacionih tehnologija. Autor je različitih prezentacija i radova o pravu u oblasti IKT i digitalnim pravima koji su održani na domaćim i međunarodnim konferencijama. Vlasnik je jedine rumunske internet stranice posvećene pravu o IT - Internet zakoni - www.legi-internet.ro gde ponekad objavljuje blogove o IKT i pravnim pitanjima.

Ella Jakubowska is a senior policy advisor at European Digital Rights (EDRI), Europe's biggest network of digital human rights NGOs. She leads on the topic of biometrics, the EU law on the cross-border exchange of personal data by police, and the EU regulation on CSAM online, and supports efforts on the EU Artificial Intelligence Act. In her work against biometric mass surveillance, she collaborates with colleagues across Europe to resist laws or policies which treat people as walking barcodes. In all her work, Ella fights to uphold rights to privacy, free expression and non-discrimination. She is trained in the sociology of technology, with a strong interest in intersectional feminist approaches. In 2021, Ella was named one of Politico Europe's 28 most influential people in the European tech space.

Bogdan Manolea is the Executive Director of the digital rights organisation ApTI Romania. Bogdan has a legal background and a vast experience of over 20 years in the Law and IT&C. Author of various presentations and articles on subject related to IT&C Law and digital rights in national and international conferences. Owner of the only Romanian web page dedicated to the IT Law - Internet Laws - www.legi-internet.ro where he sometimes blogs about ITC & legal issues.

II panel: Pokretači i infrastruktura curenja podataka u medije

Panelisti: Jelena Zorić, novinarka, Ivan Trišović, šef odseka u Sektoru za nadzor nad zaštitom podataka o ličnosti, Poverenik za informacije od javnog značaja i zaštitu podataka o ličnosti, Igor Vukotić, žrtva povrede privatnosti, dr Jelena Kleut, Filozofski fakultet, Univerzitet u Novom Sadu

[Monitoring kršenja prava na privatnost u medijima](#) koji je objavila organizacija Partneri Srbija pokazuje da mediji agresivno zadiru u privatnost građana, objavljujući privatne podatke onda kada za njima ne postoji javni interes. Pored toga, curenje informacija iz javnih institucija i zloupotrebe privatnosti u medijima nesrazmerno pogađaju najranjivije – decu, žrtve nasilnih i drugih krivičnih dela i prekršaja, pripadnike LGBT+ zajednice, socijalno ugrožene građane. Takođe, tabloidi mediji se često instrumentalizuju da bi diskreditovali ili eksponirali lica koja su interesantna različitim interesnim grupama, uključujući državu. Posledice ovakvih kršenja privatnosti u medijima, a naročito na internetu, jake su i dugotrajne. Zbog agresivnog ponašanja medija i nedostatka adekvatnih institucionalnih reakcija takva praksa je tokom godina normalizovana. To ima razorne posledice na tkivo društva i smanjuje poverenje u medije i institucije.

Dragana Žarković Obradović je direktorka Balkanske istraživačke mreže u Srbiji (BIRN Srbija), medijske organizacije koja okuplja vodeće istraživačke novinare, i istraživače u oblasti razvoja mediskog sektora. Tokom njenog mandata, BIRN je postao prepoznatljiv po profesionalizmu i uticaju u oblasti razvoja medija i vladavine prava. Redakcija BIRN-a dobitnik je brojnih domaćih i međunarodnih novinarskih nagrada.

II panel: Drivers and Infrastructure of Media Leaks

[Media privacy rights monitoring report](#) published by Partners Serbia, shows that the media are aggressively invading citizens' privacy, by publishing private data when there is no public interest for that. Information leakages from public institutions and privacy abuses in the media also disproportionately affect the most vulnerable ones – children, victims of violence and other crimes and offenses, members of LGBT+ community, socially deprived citizens. Also, tabloid media are often instrumentalized to discredit or expose people in the interest of various interest groups, including the state. Consequences of such privacy violations in the media, especially when taking place online, are acute and long-lasting. Aggressive behavior of the media, and the lack of the adequate institutional reactions over the years have normalized such practices. This has devastating effects on the social fabric, diminishing trust in both media and in the institutions.

Dragana Žarković Obradović is the Director of the Balkan Investigative Reporting Network in Serbia (BIRN Serbia), a media organization that rallies leading investigative reporters and researchers in the field of media sector development. During her term, BIRN became recognizable for its professionalism and influence in the development of media and rule of law. BIRN has won numerous national and international awards for journalism.

Jelena Zorić je novinarka istraživačke mreže BIRN i nedeljnika Vreme. Radila je na televizijama Insajder, TV N1 i Studio B. Bavi se istraživačkim radom iz oblasti organizovanog kriminala. Do maja 2021. radila je na Tv N1, na koji je 2014. godine prešla sa Studija B. Od 2008. godine Zorićeva se bavi izveštavanjem iz oblasti crne hronike, organizovanog kriminala i iz situacija koje se mogu okarakterisati kao bezbednosno interesantne. Autorka je nekoliko emisija o korona bolnicama u Beogradu, kao i o aferama „Helikopter“, „Krušik“, „Jovanjica“. U javnosti je posebno zapažen njen rad tokom izveštavanja sa antivladinih protesta u julu 2020. godine, kao i izveštavanje na temu organizovanog kriminala o slučaju Jovanjica. Zbog tog slučaja u nekoliko navrata su joj upućene i pretnje. Dobitnica je više novinarskih nagrada i državnog priznanja.

Ivan Trišović je diplomirao na Fakultetu političkih nauka Univerziteta u Beogradu, na katedri za političku teoriju i metodologiju, gde je potom završio master akademske studije politikologije. Doktorand je Pravnog fakulteta Univerziteta u Beogradu, gde je završio i master akademske studije iz oblasti ustavnog prava. Akreditovani je predavač Nacionalne akademije za javnu upravu u više oblasti i Poverenika u oblasti zaštite podataka o ličnosti. Predavao je po pozivu na master akademskim studijama pri Rektoratu Univerziteta u Beogradu, oblast kriznog menadžmenta, kao i na nekoliko privatnih fakulteta, oblast zaštite podataka o ličnosti. Radio je u organima uprave. Zaposlen je u Službi Poverenika, na mestu šefa odseka u Sektoru za nadzor nad zaštitom podataka o ličnosti.

Jelena Zorić is a journalist for the Balkan Investigative Reporting Network (BIRN) and the Vreme weekly. She worked at the Insider, TV N1 and Studio B television stations. She is an investigative reporter on organized crime. Until May 2021, she worked for TV N1, to which she had moved from Studio B in 2014. Since 2008, Zorić has been reporting on crime, organized crime and situations that can be described as security related. She is the author of a number of broadcasts on COVID-19 hospitals in Belgrade, as well as on the Helicopter, Krušik and Jovanjica scandals. The public has particularly noticed her coverage of the July 2020 anti-government protests and reporting on organized crime in the Jovanjica case. Because of this case, she has received threats on several occasions. She has received a number of awards for journalism as well as a state recognition.

Ivan Trišović graduated from the University of Belgrade Faculty of Political Sciences, Department of Political Theory and Methodology, where he also completed the master's studies on political science. He is a doctoral student at the University of Belgrade Faculty of Law, where he has also completed his master's studies in constitutional law. He is an accredited lecturer of the National Academy for Public Administration on a number of topics and of the Commissioner on the topic of personal data protection. He held invited lectures on crisis management at the master's academic studies at the University of Belgrade Rectorate, and on personal data protection at several private faculties. He worked at administrative authorities. He is employed at the Office of the Commissioner, as head of a department at the Sector for Supervision of Personal Data Protection.

Igor Vukotić potiče iz jedne obične radničke porodice. Od rođenja do dana današnjeg živi u Zemunu, gde je završio osnovnu i srednju školu. Diplomirani ekonomista (zaposlen u domaćoj kompaniji kao direktor prodaje). Nikada nije bio osuđivan niti se bavio bilo kakvim protivzakonitim radnjama. Nije se bavio politikom, nije pripadnik ni simpatizer ni jedne političke stranke. Dodirne tačke sa medijima nije imao do pre-22. decembra 2020.godine. Za sebe kaže da je jedan običan uzorni građanin Republike Srbije.

Igor Vukotić comes from an ordinary working family. Since his birth he has lived in Zemun, where he completed primary and secondary school. He holds an economics degree (works as a sales manager at a Serbian company). He has never been convicted or participated in illegal activities. He has never been involved in politics and is neither a member nor a supporter of any political party. He had nothing to do with the media until December 22, 2020. He describes himself as an ordinary, model citizen of the Republic of Serbia.

dr Jelena Kleut je vanredna profesorka na Odseku za medijske studije Filozofskog fakultetu, Univerzitet u Novom Sadu. Magistrirala je i doktorirala iz oblasti komunikologije na Fakultetu političkih nauka u Beogradu. Predsedavajuća je Sekcije za studije publike i recepcije u Evropskoj asocijaciji za komunikološka istraživanja i obrazovanje (ECREA). Bavi se medijskom publikom, novinarstvom i digitalnim komuniciranjem. Autorka je više od 40 naučnih radova koji su objavljeni u zemlji i inostranstvu, kao i niza istraživačkih izveštaja koji se, između ostalog, bave tretmanom privatnosti u medijima. Kao medijska ekspertkinja i članica Nezavisnog društva novinara Vojvodine učestvovala u pisanju Medijske strategije Republike Srbije.

dr Jelena Kleut is an associate professor at the University of Novi Sad Faculty of Philosophy Department of Media Studies. She got her master's and doctoral degrees in the field of communication sciences at the Faculty of Political Sciences in Belgrade. She chairs the Audience and Reception Studies Section of the European Communication Research and Education Association (ECREA). She specializes in media audience, journalism and digital communication. She wrote more than 40 papers which have been published in the country and abroad, as well as a number of research reports dealing with, *inter alia*, the treatment of privacy in the media. As a media expert and a member of the Independent Association of Journalists of Vojvodina, she participated in the drafting of the Media Strategy of the Republic of Serbia.

III panel: dokumentarni film “Do daske”

Gost: **Aleksandar Reljić**, režiser

Višestruko nagrađivani dokumentarni film “Do daske” scenariste i reditelja Aleksandra Reljića, govori o slučaju novosadskog stiliste Srđana Švelja, kojeg su mediji osudili za pedofiliju, a da mu sud nikada nije ni sudio za to delo.

Početak 2020. godine u svim medijima su pompezno najavljivana hapšenja pedofila političara i drugih javnih ličnosti. Policija je 28. januara 2020. godine umesto njih - uhapsila modnog fotografa, stilistu i DJ-a iz Novog Sada Srđana Švelja. Pre zvaničnog privođenja, mediji su već objavili da je Šveljo “pedofil”, koji je “silovao, podvodio, drogirao i fotografisao dečake u pornografske svrhe”. Tabloidi su ga nazvali monstrumom i predatorom, a njegov lik i ime objavljivali na naslovnim stranama. Išli su toliko daleko da su prozivali sudije da mu dosude najstrožu kaznu zatvora od 40 godina. Iako je tužilaštvo u Novom Sadu podiglo optužnicu u kojoj nijedna tačka optužnice nije bila povezana sa pedofilijom, javnost to nije mogla da sazna, jer je suđenje bilo zatvoreno. Čoveku je uništen život i ugled, a najavljena hapšenja političara pedofila se do danas nisu dogodila. Srđan Šveljo vodi preko petnaest sudskih procesa protiv medija.

Film “Do daske”, rađen je u koprodukciji Core Dox, BIRN Srbije i Awakenings Film.

Aleksandar Reljić je novinar i autor brojnih dokumentarnih filmova, koji su se uglavnom bavili temama kulture sećanja, ratnih zločina, zaštite ljudskih prava, ksenofobije i sl. Autor je u Dokumentarno-obrazovnom programu Radio televizije Vojvodine, a dve godine je bio na mestu odgovornog urednika te redakcije. Njegov film „Enkel” (Unuk), dobio je više domaćih i stranih priznanja i bio nominovan za Najbolji evropski

III panel: movie “No Pardon”

Guest: **Aleksandar Reljic**, Director

The multi-award-winning documentary *Do Daske* (All the Way) by screenwriter and director Aleksandar Reljić presents the case of Novi Sad stylist Srđan Šveljo, who was condemned for pedophilia by the media although no court proceedings against him had ever been held for this crime.

In early 2020, all media grandly announced the arrests of pedophiles among politicians and other public figures. Instead, on January 28, 2020, police arrested Novi Sad fashion photographer, stylist and DJ Srđan Šveljo. Before the arrest, media already described Šveljo as a “pedophile” who had “raped, pimped, drugged and photographed boys for pornographic purposes”. Tabloids described him as a monster and a predator, and his face and name were all over the front pages. They went so far as to call upon judges to give him the maximum 40-year prison sentence. Although the indictment filed against him by the Novi Sad prosecutor’s office had nothing to do with pedophilia, the public could not find this out because the trial was closed to the public. The man’s life was ruined, and his reputation destroyed, while the announced arrests of pedophiles among politicians have never happened. Srđan Šveljo is involved in more than 15 court proceedings against media.

Do Daske was co-produced by Core Dox, BIRN Serbia and Awakenings Film.

Aleksandar Reljić is a journalist and author of numerous documentaries, which mainly dealt with the topics of culture of remembrance, war crimes, human rights protection, xenophobia, etc. He is an author in the Documentary and Educational Program of the Vojvodina Radio-Television, and he spent two years as editor in charge of that Program. His film *Enkel*

Roundtable: PDP-related Initiatives in the National Assembly

The participants in this round table will discuss the impact assessment of processing on personal data protection. In the introductory part, a methodology for assessing the impact of processing on personal data protection in legislative processes will be presented, and its importance will be highlighted by its authors, one of whom is an international expert with experience in this field. The participants will also discuss the harmonization of sectoral regulations with the provisions of the Law on Personal Data Protection, legal standards in this field, and the control and appropriate implementation of these provisions. A special emphasis will be laid on the role of the National Assembly in improving the overall area of personal data protection, as well as on the exchange of experiences of representatives of relevant institutions in this area.

During this session, we will try to answer questions on the blockchain technology and online data privacy. The blockchain data privacy was one of the main promises of the industry that had developed around this technology. To what extent is data on the blockchain really private? Can this technology be used for anonymous financial transactions towards unknown recipients? Is this field regulated and is the regulation also related to user privacy? Privacy issues in the EU are governed by the GDPR set of regulations. We will also try to find out to what extent blockchain can meet all data privacy requirements. However, in order to expand our discussion, we will review possible worst-case scenarios regarding the use of blockchain technology by governments throughout the world. Can blockchain play a negative role in the digitally advanced world of the future?

Arvin Kamberi works at the DiploFoundation and is currently editor of the Cryptocurrencies topic at the Geneva Internet Platform DigitalWatch digital policy observatory (<https://dig.watch/>). In addition to this, he works as an associate at public diplomacy courses organized by the DiploFoundation for diplomats from more than 80 countries. I panel: Scrutiny and Ethics of the Use of Artificial Intelligence

Upotreba veštačke inteligencije (AI) dovodi do niza etičkih problema, uključujući pitanja koja se odnose na pristrasnost, transparentnost, odgovornost i mogući negativan uticaj na zapošljavanje i društvo. Ipak, ne postoji nijedan jedinstveni globalni okvir za regulisanje veštačke inteligencije, a pristup regulisanju se veoma razlikuje između različitih zemalja. Neke zemlje su usvojile posebne zakone i propise u vezi sa veštačkom inteligencijom. Nasuprot tome, druge su u postojeće zakone unele odredbe o veštačkoj inteligenciji ili su usvojile smernice ili principe za upravljanje njenom upotrebom. Na panelu o nadzoru i etičnosti upotrebe veštačke inteligencije čućemo govornike iz Srbije i EU. Oni će podeliti naučene lekcije, najbolje prakse i ideje o regulisanju veštačke inteligencije i o nadziranju i promovisanju njene etičke upotrebe u vreme sve veće političke polarizacije i ekonomske nejednakosti. Pored toga, panelisti će dati konkretne preporuke za ulogu koju bi civilno društvo, nezavisni mediji, kao i akademska i međunarodna zajednica mogli da odigraju u nadzoru i etičkom raspoređivanju AI od strane Vlade Srbije.

Vukašin Petrović je svoju profesionalnu i akademsku karijeru posvetio promovisanju i zaštiti demokratije, ljudskih prava, slobode izražavanja i medija. The use of artificial intelligence (AI) raises a number of ethical concerns, including issues related to bias, transparency, accountability, and the potential negative impact on employment and society. However, there is no single global framework for regulating artificial intelligence (AI), and the approach to regulation varies widely among countries. Some countries have enacted specific laws and regulations related to AI. In contrast, others have incorporated AI-related provisions into existing laws or have established guidelines or principles to govern its use. The Panel on Scrutiny and Ethics of the Use of Artificial Intelligence will feature speakers from Serbia and the EU. They will share lessons learned, best practices, and ideas about regulating AI and how to oversee and promote its ethical use during a time of rising political polarization and economic inequality. In addition, the panelists will provide concrete recommendations for the role that civil society, independent media, academia, and the international community could play in the oversight and ethical deployment of AI by the government of Serbia.

Vukašin Petrović has dedicated his professional and academic career to the promotion and protection of democracy, human rights, freedom of expression and media. As Vice President of the DT Institute, he is a member of the executive team, where he leads the Institute's strategy for the promotion and protection of human rights and democracy, oversees a portfolio of programs of support to non-governmental organizations, and manages the Institute's engagement with governments and multilateral institutions. Before he joined the DT Institute, Vukašin held senior positions at several international non-governmental organizations, including Freedom House, where he was Senior Director for Strategy and Director of the Global Human Rights Support Mechanism Program.
